Course Synopsis

Moot Court Exercise

Every student is required to participate in at least three moot courts which will be on an assigned problem. Marks will be given on the basis of written submission and oral advocacy. Written submissions shall include brief summary of facts, issues involved, provisions of laws and arguments, citation, prayer, etc. Marks for oral advocacy may be awarded for communication skills, presentations, language, legal reference, court manners, etc. Written Memorials submitted by the students shall be kept by the Teacher concerned for further verification. The performance of student in the moot court shall be evaluated by a committee consisting of (i) Chairman of the Department (ii) an Advocate with 10 years experience at the Bar; and (iii) the Teacher concerned.

Observance of Trial in Two Cases, One Civil and One Criminal

Students are required to attend courts to observe at least one civil and one criminal case. They shall maintain a record and enter the various steps observed during their attendance on different days in the court assignment. The Court Observation Record submitted by the students should be evaluated by a committee consisting of (i) Chairman of the Department/the Concerned Teacher (ii) External Examiner appointed by the Department and (iii) an Advocate with 10 years experience at the Bar. Court attendance shall be compulsory

and details shall be recorded in a Record Book kept therefore. This may be carried under the supervision of Concerned Teacher.

Interviewing Techniques and Pre-Trial Preparations and Internship/Court Visit Diary

Each student should observe two interview sessions of clients either in the Lawyer's Office or in the Legal Aid Office and record the proceedings in a diary. Each student has to further observe the preparation of documents and court papers by the Advocate and the procedure for the filing of the suit/petition. This shall be recorded in the diary which shall clearly indicate the dates on which the above observations are made and they shall be authenticated by the Advocate concerned. Evaluation of the above diary shall be made by the committee consisting of (i) Chairman of the Department/the Concerned Course Teacher (ii) External Examiner appointed by the Department and (iii) an Advocate with 10 years' experience at the Bar.
